Lesson 8: Transport

Vehicles (транспортное средство)

You travel around the country by different vehicles (**тра́нспортное сре́дство**). Some of them travel far distances like planes (**самолёт**) or ships (**кора́бль**), some have special routes (**маршру́т**) like buses (**авто́бус**), trolleybuses (**тролле́йбус**) or trams (**трамва́й**). And others can travel various distances such as trains (**по́езд**) or cars (**автомоби́ль** or **маши́на**), or have no specific route like a taxi.

Let's take a closer look at them.

Planes (самолёт)

You probably arrived to Russia by plane. The plane has wings (крыло́) and engines (дви́гатель) to keep it flying, a tail (хвост). You watch to the illuminator (иллюмина́тор) while inside the plane and use a ramp (трап) to walk out of the



plane.

You go out of the plane to the airport (аэропо́рт) and claim (забира́ть) your luggage (бага́ж).

You can see people standing in a line (о́чередь) at the registration booth (сто́йка регистра́ции) for check-in (регистра́ция).



You also can see a schedule (расписа́ние) in the terminal (термина́л).

Usually, a terminal has different areas for departures (вы́лет) and arrivals (прилёт).

You can take a shuttle (шатл) to get to another terminal or a taxi or bus to the city.

There are even special trains that can quickly get you from the airport to the city. In Moscow they are called 'aəpoəkcnpécc'.

A car (машина)


A car is the most common vehicle. In Russia you can meet any model of car, from the cheapest to the most expensive. They run on petrol (бензи́н), diesel (ди́зель), gas (газ) or even electricity (электри́чество).

Let's take a closer look at the car.

Every car has wheels (колесо́) to move, which consists of a wheel hub (диск) and a tire (покры́шка от ши́на). You enter a car through the door by pulling a door knob (дверна́я ру́чка). A driver (води́тель) sits on a driver's seat (води́тельское кре́сло) uses the steering wheel (руль) to turn the car. Respectively, the passenger (пассажи́р) sits in a passanger's seat (пассажи́рское кре́сло). The driver shows the direction where he wants to turn with the turn signal (поворо́тник) and watches the mirrors (зе́ркало) to see if the path is clear. The windshield (ветрово́е стекло́) protects the driver from the wind and the wipers (дво́рники) keeps it from dirt and rain. The driver uses pedals (педа́ль) to drive the car: gas pedal (педа́ль га́за) for acceleration and breaking (тормоза́) for deceleration and stopping, and sometimes the clutch pedal (педа́ль сцепле́ния). If it's getting dark, the driver turns on the lights (фа́ра).

The car is powered by an engine (дви́гатель or мото́р), it usually is in the front of the car under the hood (капо́т). And additionally protected with a bumper (ба́мпер).

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You put your luggage (бага́ж) into the trunk (бага́жник).

The registration number (**Homephóй знак** or **Hómep**) should be placed at the front and rear of the car.

Train (по́езд)

A train travels by rail (ре́льсы). Trains go from large railway stations (вокза́л) and travel to other railway stations of smaller size (железнодоро́жная ста́нция or simply ста́нция). There you can buy a ticket (биле́т) for the train or wait for your train in the waiting lounge (зал ожида́ния). You can leave your luggage in the storage room (ка́мера хране́ния) and take a walk in the city, if you are not in a hurry.

Passengers wait for the train on a platform (платфо́рма). Platforms are usually connected with an underground passage (подзе́мный перехо́д) or an overhead passage (надзе́мный перехо́д).

A train consists of a locomotive (локомоти́в) and cars (ваго́н). A train is driven by a driver (машини́ст). Cars consist of compartments (купе́).

The conductor (проводни́к) checks tickets (проверя́ть биле́т) and serves passengers during travel over long distances.



In the large cities in Russia there is an undergroung rapid transport system – 'метро́', which allows passengers to get quickly to the desired stations especially during rush hours (час пик). There you don't have a personal seat, but most of the time you stand (стоя́ть), holding the handbars (по́ручень).

A tram (**трамвай**) is a small train with two or three cars moving along the ground (unlike underground). Nowadays they are almost replaced with the metro, buses and trolleybuses in Russia.

Ships (Кора́бль)

A ship is a vehicle that travels on water: a river (**река́**), lake (**о́зеро**) or sea (**мо́ре**). However, space vehilcles are also called 'space ships' (**косми́ческий кора́бль**).

The old ships used sails (па́рус) and paddles (весло́) to move. Such ships are called 'па́русник'. Modern ships use engines fo turn the propeller (винт) or even to hover over the water surface (возду́шная поду́шка).



Ships can vary in size from tiny boats (ло́дка), luxury yachts (я́хта) to the giant cruise liners (круи́зный ла́йнер), so big that it cannot dock (приста́ть) in the harbor (га́вань or бу́хта). The place in the port (порт) where ships dock is called 'причал'.

Ships sail (пла́вать, though professional sailors (моря́к) get offended by the verb 'плавать' with regards to ships and say 'ходи́ть') from port to port carrying passengers and cargo (груз).

A ship sails under a captain's (капита́н) command and operated by a crew (кома́нда).
